A Few Birding Highlights: 40 species of hummingbird often seen including Velvet-purple Coronet, Empress Brilliant, Sparkling Violetear, Gorgeted Sunangel, Purple-bibbed Whitetip, Fawn-breasted Brilliant, Booted Racket-tail, Sword-billed Hummingbird, Andean Emerald, and Violet-tailed Sylph. Others bird species include Collared Trogon, Choco Trogon, Broad-billed Motmot, Toucan Barvet, White-whiskered Puffbird, Chocó Toucan, Scale-crested Pygmy-Tyrant, Black-billed Shrike-Tyrant, Saffron-crowned Tanager, Flame-faced Tanager, Beryl-spangled Tanager, Scarlet-and-white Tanager, Guira Tanager, Blue-whiskered Tanager, Purple-throated Fruitcrow, Sunbittern, Russet Antshrike, Common Potoo, Ash-breasted Sierra-Finch, Curve-billed Tinamou, Black-chested Buzzard-Eagle, Andean Condor, and Andean Cock-of-the-Rock. Most birders add several hundred life birds.

Weather Profile: 50 to 70s most days, warmer at Rio Silanche, with chances of rain each day. Think layers of clothing.
